Steps to becoming an RD - Education A graduate degree is required from an accredited dietetics program

 Classes range from food and nutrition sciences, foodservice management, business, economics, computer science, culinary arts, sociology, communication, biochemistry, physiology, microbiology, anatomy and physiology.

My undergraduate degree was at SEMO. I did an unconventional route after my degree. I was offered a graduate assistantship at University of Missouri in their Athletic Department. I completed my Master's degree and then went on to my internship. Steps to becoming an RD - Internship Completion of a supervised practice requirement

- At least 1000 hours of supervised practice to gain real-world experience and apply knowledge learned in the classroom to the content of a variety of work settings
- Typical internships consist of a clinical, food service and community rotation

Internship process can make or break a person, here's why:

- Matching process
- Financial responsibility
- Relocation

Steps to becoming an RD -Internship

- My internship was with University of Oklahoma Health Sciences
 - Clinical & Food Service rotation McAlester Regional Health Center, OK
 - Community rotation WIC, University of Oklahoma Athletic Department, Camp NoHiLo
 - Elective rotation University of Oregon Athletic Department

- Pass a national exam for RDNS
 - A supervised national exam is required to become a dietitian once you have completed your practice hours and are now eligible for the exam portion.

Steps to becoming an RD – National Exam

State Licensure

- Each state has different requirements on how to practice as a dietitian. It is important to make sure you are following those requirements.
- In Illinois, you will need to have a state license to practice medical nutrition therapy. You can practice for up to 6 months after your application is submitted.



SIH Careers as a Dietitian There are probably a lot more options for what a Dietitian is qualified to do in terms of roles at SIH. The two that come to mind are:

Clinical Dietitian

My role: HR Health Management Navigator

Clinical Dietitian



Job duties can include:

Patient education, calculations and orders for feedings through tube or vein, nutrition assessments, patient diet orders, evaluate and monitor patient status

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Primary role: ensure patient's nutritional status does not worsen and is appropriate for their conditions What is an HR Health Management Navigator?



A fancy title for "Dietitian Health Coach."



Work 1:1 with the employees who either have a chronic condition of Diabetes, Hypertension or Hyperlipidemia, or those who are seeking health coaching services.



Health coaching is patient/employee driven and they lead the conversation
