WHAT IS THE PSAT/NMSQT & WHY REGISTER TO TAKE IT?

The PSAT/NMSQT will be administered for CCHS students on <u>January 26th</u> at Carbondale Community High School. When taken as a junior, this assessment is the qualifying exam for National Merit Scholarship consideration.



- Interested students, please sign up in the Principal's Office any school day between November 6-20
- The cost is \$17 (bring exact change or a check made payable to CCHS).
- No payments will be accepted after <u>November 20.</u>
- Fee waivers are available for students who qualify under the Free/Reduced Lunch Program. When registering, please inform the Principal's Office.

We will be following guidelines set forth by ISBE, IDPH, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to ensure a safe testing environment. As with all events during this pandemic, schedules will be subject to change. We will notify you as soon as we have additional information.

PSAT/NMSQT GENERAL INFORMATION:

Can I take the PSAT/NMSQT again in January if I took it on October 29, 2020?

No, College Board only permits you to take it once during your junior year.

What is the purpose of the PSAT/NMSQT test?

When taken as a junior, the PSAT/NMSQT is the qualifying exam for National Merit Scholarship consideration. National Merit Information can be found here. By taking the PSAT/NMSQT, students will also prepare themselves for the format and content of the SAT (a national college entrance exam to be taken spring of junior year).

Who takes the PSAT/NMSOT?

It is recommended for high performing 10th and 11th grade students.

Is the PSAT/NMSQT test optional or required?

The PSAT/NMSQT test is optional and available only by registering.

What areas does the PSAT/NMSQT test cover?

The content of the test includes: Reading; Writing and Language; & Math.

** GPA is one highly noted indicator linked to postsecondary success in addition to attendance and test scores. **

UPCOMING QUARTER 2 VISITS

Mrs. Krutsinger and Mrs. Murphy will be visiting students in their English 3 classes in the 2^{nd} quarter to explore college options and create plans for post-secondary endeavors.

How can you help at home?

- o Have conversations with your student about his/her plans; provide support and encourage exploration. Support student's interests, skills, and values as they explore—making sure the goals & personality of the student are well matched with those of the college; this helps in finding the right fit for college.
- o Encourage your student to sign up for college visits, fairs, etc.
- o Be aware of college admissions requirements (HS courses, GPA, SAT scores).
- o Help your student stay organized (follow College Planning: 11th Grade handout provided in students' red folder) and set goals for the year.
- o Urge your student to study for the SAT in April (utilize Naviance, College Board, & Khan Academy).
- o Search together colleges that meet your child's needs (check out this website).
