If you only read one thing in this folder, let it be this!!!

- YOUR GRADES MATTER! Every single one of them. Failing a class will greatly impact next year's class options. Failing a class may also result in you needing to attend Credit Recovery or summer school ②. Something else to consider: not doing well in a class may prevent you from taking a class in the future. Ultimately your freshman year grades are important because they will weigh into your GPA.
- YOUR HABITS MATTER! Ninth grade is a "make it or break it" year. It is a pivotal time where you should be learning good study habits, organizational skills, and practicing self-care.

Tip: Be here. Your attendance is so important. Keep in mind missing a day means missing 6 classes. It can be challenging trying to make up the work of 6 classes.
